Dear Sir/Madam

We are writing on behalf of the clubs affiliated with the Delft Local Football Association to inform you of a decisive action we are taking regarding the composition of our Executive Committee.

After a thorough review of our current structure and future requirements, we are confident that significant changes are necessary for the betterment of our association. Accordingly, we are submitting a **Vote of No Confidence** in the Executive Committee of the Delft Local Football Association, effective immediately.

This resolution is not just a reaction; it is a strategic move aligned with our goals and the evolving needs of our organization. We have identified several compelling reasons to support this vote of no confidence:

1. Personal Interests:

The executive consistently prioritizes personal interests over the best interests of the clubs.

2. Resignations Due to Irregularities:

Over the past five years, numerous executive members have resigned in protest against the irregularities tolerated by the President.

3. Improperly Appointed Members:

New members are being added to the executive without adhering to the established procedures outlined in Article 34.1.3. (Page28)

4. Economic Risks:

The actions of the Executive are jeopardizing the economic stability of the clubs, threatening our very foundation as an association.

5. Lack of Transparency in Financial Projects:

The President's initiation of the Delft Development Project has not been adequately communicated to our members, raising serious concerns about its potential financial impact on the association.

6. Failure of Fiduciary Responsibilities:

There has been a clear failure to uphold fiduciary duties in managing the association's assets.

7. Financial Mismanagement:

Clubs are consistently left in the dark regarding financial activities, leading to a breakdown in trust and accountability.

8. Unfair and Biased Decisions:

Decisions made by the Executive have repeatedly resulted in unfair outcomes that negatively impact specific clubs.

9. Unauthorized Clearances:

The Executive has issued over twenty (20) clearances for the Delft Development Program without consulting the clubs. Article 5 (clauses 5.1 and 5.2, page 12) clearly stipulates that player status and transfer procedures must be managed by the Executive in compliance with SAFA regulations.

10. Communication Breakdown:

A serious lack of communication exists between the Executive and the clubs. There is no formal correspondence from SAFA Cape Town to our clubs, and meeting minutes are not being shared, leaving clubs dissatisfied and uninformed. Article 33 (Page27) clause 33.3 clearly states that the General Secretary shall compile the agenda for the general meeting and must sent it out seven (7) calender days before the meeting. Both the President as well as the General Secretary are in violation of the Constitution.

11. Unreasonable Transport Costs:

Certain clubs are being charged transport costs of at least R150.00 for registration activities, which are also billed to the LFA.

12. Facility Usage Fees:

Teams are charged R300.00 per game for facility usage, yet these funds are not properly accounted for in the association's financial records, including gate fees and tuck-shop rentals.

13. Neglect of Youth Football:

The focus on youth football has diminished, as evidenced by the incomplete league for 2025, which is unacceptable.

14. Last-Minute Fixture Distribution:

Fixtures are sent to clubs only on Thursdays, allowing little time for adequate planning, which consistently leads to games running late. Furthermore, clubs often receive multiple fixtures at once, causing confusion and chaos.

15. Irregularities in the Annual Awards Presentation:

The 2025 Annual Awards Presentation took place without necessary preliminary meetings for the Junior and Senior Divisions to finalize fixtures for outstanding games. None of the clubs received final logs for either division for their review.

16. Expulsion

Azzuro FC was expelled from the LFA without the knowledge of the General Council of the Delft LFA according to Article 15.2 (Page17) that the presence of an absolute majority of eligible members entitled to vote at the AGM is necessary for an expulsion to be valid, and the motion for an expulsion must be adopted by a two-third majority valid votes cast.

These issues demand urgent action, and we are resolute in our commitment to restoring integrity and accountability within our association.

We appreciate your attention to this matter and look forward to your support in this essential cause.
